Course Description:

This course is a study of Euclidean spaces, general linear spaces and inner product spaces. Topics include linear independence and dependence; bases and linear transformations; matrices and determinants with application to linear systems; change of basis; and representation of linear transformation and inner products. Prerequisite: MAT 142.

Course Outcomes:

- To introduce students to the uses of matrices and determinants in solving systems of equations.
- To introduce students to the general theory of vector spaces and linear transformations.
- To introduce students to the standards and methods of written proofs.
- To develop students ability to read standard written mathematics.

Assessment:

There will be three exams each accounting for 25% of your final average and a cumulative final exam contributing 25%.

The grade scale that I will use to assign final grades is A (93 and up), A- (90-93), B+ (87-90), B (83-87), B- (80-83), C+ (77-80), C (73-77), C- (70-73), D+ (67-70), D (60-67), F(Below 60).

Attendance in class is expected of all students and mandatory on exam days, but it will not be factored numerically into your grade. Make-up exams will be given only with prior notification and documentation of a legitimate excuse.
