Required Text: Business Law: Principles and Practices, Goldman & Sigismond, Seventh Edition

Course Description: Business relationships are largely based on contractual agreements. This course provides an introduction to the legal system as it affects business – the nature and sources of law, legal process and institutions. Students will examine the legal environment of business balanced against an individual's rights and responsibilities in a free society. Particular emphasis will be placed on contracts at common law and under the Uniform Commercial Code, and how these principles apply to modern business practice.

Course Objectives:

- 1. Discuss the legal environment of business.
- 2. Understand the adversary and court systems.
- 3. Identify and analyze various laws that regulate business.
- 4. Read, understand, analyze and draft a contract.

5. Describe the elements that form a legally enforceable agreement among interested parties.

- 6. Understand breach of contract and available remedies.
- 7. Become familiar with the Uniform Commercial Code.

Student Outcomes: Upon successful completion of this course, the student will have proficiency in the above.

Course Requirements:

Attendance: Class participation constitutes 25% of the students' final grade; therefore, class attendance is important. Assigned reading is to be completed prior to class, and students must be prepared to discuss the material. Class discussions will supplement, not summarize, the text material.

Grading: Final grades will be calculated as follows:

- 10% class participation
- 30% midterm exam
- 30% average of quizzes
- 30% final exam
