Course Description:

This course is aimed at providing the student with a broad-based introduction to the field of psychology. After an introduction to and overview of the field, including a discussion of the history of the field and a description of methods of psychological research, attention is given to such topics as: biological foundations of human behavior, sensation and perception, basic principles of learning, memory, development, personality, abnormal behavior, psychotherapy, and social behavior. The course is geared to provide a basic introduction to the field that will fit the needs of the non-major desiring a basic knowledge of psychology as well as the needs of psychology or other social science majors desiring an in-depth survey of the discipline.
