Course Description

The Senior Art Exhibition will challenge the graduating Art Major to develop a body of work culminating in a group exhibition. Content, presentation, current art world issues will be addressed. The focus of the course is the historical evolution of exhibition space and specific artists and writers concerned with exhibition.

The course meets weekly for presentations, discussions, conversations, individual and group critique. In addition to class time, students are expected to work outside of class in the studio to create a body of work. *You must be enrolled in a studio course to be enrolled in this course.*

Students are required to attend all artist talks on campus and are strongly encouraged to research shows off campus and in the region to better prepare them for their own show and for the future. Students are also encouraged to seek critical advice from outside of class.

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course the student will have a firm understanding of what exhibiting in contemporary society entails. The student is also expected to maintain good studio practice throughout the semester that demonstrates commitment. The student is expected to contribute to the class in the form of oral and written assignments. And participate in critiques of their peers. The student is expected to become familiar with contemporary concepts of presentation within their chosen media.

<u>Honor Philosophy</u>

This class will be conducted in accordance with the Cedar Crest College Honor Code.
